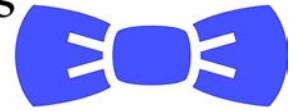

Rabbi Gottlieb is the managing director of Tzalash, helping soldiers maintain their religious commitment along with their IDF service. He is a former Rabbi of Baltimore's Shomrei Emunah shul, and current Rabbi of Kehillat HaEla, a growing community near Ramat Beit Shemesh.

Motzoei Shabbat, 8 PM: *Being Religious in the IDF: An Insider's Perspective (followed by Q&A).*

held in Gaza by the terrorist organization Hamas. Most of the hostages are civilians, including 14 women, 9 elderly over the age of 65, and 2 children.
