Run For Their Lives is a global initiative with over 200 groups around the world, to raise awareness for the immediate release of the hostages still being held in Gaza by the terrorist organization Hamas. Most of the hostages are civilians, including 14 women, 9 elderly over the age of 65, and 2 children.
