Tisha B'Av Speaker—In the early 1990s, about 20 years into his practice as a maxillofacial surgeon and professor thereof, Dr. Howard Israel of Cornell Weil in New York City learned by accident that that his favored anatomy atlas was produced by a Nazi. This triggered shock and questions: Where did these anatomical images come from? He launched a search and then a campaign, for he discovered that in the original German version, the images were signed with swastikas interwoven in the signatures.

Ultimately, he questioned what the University of Vienna—where the Nazi professor practiced—knew, and what the book publisher knew, and

what they were hiding. Were they still using specimens obtained by the Nazis? His campaign, joined with a trusted colleague, led him to the New York Times and the Journal of the American Medical Association to exert pressure on all individuals and institutions that produced this atlas. Meanwhile, what ethical questions arose – and still arise – from the use of this atlas, which is highly regarded in the medical profession? Dr. Howard Israel will tell the story in its gut wrenching twists and turns on Tisha b'Av afternoon, 6:30 PM. There will be time for questions.

Schechter Shabbaton—Next Shabbat, we welcome Professor Shoshana & Dr. Yitzchak Schechter as our Scholars-in-Residence.

Shoshana Schechter is assistant professor of Bible at Stern College for Women and the director of the Mechina program there. A graduate of Stern College, with a BS in both Judaic Studies and English Literature, Mrs. Schechter also teaches Tanach and English at Ateres Bais Yaakov High School in Rockland County, New York. She holds masters degrees from Bernard Revel Graduate School of Jewish Studies as well as from Columbia University School of Journalism. She is a frequent lecturer on topics in Tanach and has been involved in Jewish outreach programs on four continents.

Dr. Schechter, a recognized leader in emotional and behavioral health care in the Jewish community, is a clinical psychologist and Director of The Center for Applied Psychology (CAPs) at Bikur Cholim in Monsey New York. He launched the Institute for Applied Research and Community Collaboration (ARCC), a unique institute whose mission is to conduct, analyze and disseminate rigorous research on psychiatric, psychological and social issues of the frum community in an effort to empirically base and guide decision making, resource allocation and program development.

The Schechters live in New Hempstead with their five children.
