Welcome to our Scholars-in-Residence, Dr. Yitzchak & Professor Shoshana Schechter.

Shoshana Schechter is assistant professor of Bible at Stern College for Women and the director of the Mechina program there. A graduate of Stern College, with a BS in both Judaic Studies and English Literature, Mrs. Schechter also teaches Tanach and English at Ateres Bais Yaakov High School in Rockland County, New York. She holds masters degrees from Bernard Revel Graduate School of Jewish Studies as well as from Columbia University School of Journalism. She is a frequent lecturer on topics in Tanach and has been involved in Jewish outreach programs on four continents.

Dr. Yitzchak Schechter, a recognized leader in emotional and behavioral health care in the Jewish community, is a clinical psychologist and Director of The Center for Applied Psychology (CAPs) at Bikur Cholim in Monsey. He launched the Institute for Applied Research and Community Collaboration (ARCC), a unique institute whose mission is to conduct, analyze and disseminate rigorous research on psychiatric, psychological and social issues of the frum community in an effort to empirically base and guide decision making, resource allocation and program development.

The Schechters live in New Hempstead with their five children.
